Next weekend sees the first week of the cup competitions. Once again we are in the Chatham Cup and have drawn Wanganui Athletic in round two. After a run of home matches over the last couple of seasons it was inevitable we were drawn away. At least Wanganui is not far to go! As we can draw on our Team Taranaki players for this competition we are hopeful of a good run again this year. TT coach, Ian McGrath and Premier League coach, Joe Munro will look after the team.

The Federation League team will also travel to Wanganui where they will meet Palmerston North Marist 2nds. Both games will be at Wembley Park on Saturday.

Taranaki Premier League
