Recent Results

Taranaki Premier League

Pepper Construction NP Rangers have recovered from that devastating 4-0 defeat to FC Western a few weeks ago to go unbeaten in six league and cup matches. Wins over FDMC, Woodleigh, Hawera and Inglewood in the league and a victory against Kaponga in the Duff Rosebowl have set the second half of the season. The only slight blip was last weekend's return fixture with FDMC which resulted in a 1-1 draw, the school side putting in a sterling effort for a deserved draw. With numbers stretched over the past few weeks, it has seen Jeff Yates, the regular goalkeeper appearing in defence with Daryl Foreman looking after the gloves. The stand out performer for the team so far has been Liam Dungey, while Niall Leggett has been a consistent performer chipping in with several vital goals including last week's draw with FDMC. Having failed in the past couple of years in the Duff Rosebowl, this will be a target for the team.
